The present writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying for issuance of a writ of mandamus, directing respondents No. 1 to 4 for registration of new motor vehicle/car bearing Temporary Registration Certificate No. CH-116(T)-1616, Chassis No. MA3FXGM1S00406956, Engine No. E15AN103449, purchased on 31.12.2019.

Mr. Prateek Mahajan, Advocate appears and accept notice on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 4.

Counsel for respondents No. 1 to 4 has pointed that vide order dated 13.08.2020, Hon'ble the Supreme Court has further clarified its earlier order that now onwards, the High Courts can entertain the writ petitions

only in those cases; where the **Bharat Stage (BS)-IV** vehicles were purchased and the sales were uploaded on the Government ***e-Vahan*** portal before 31.03.2020.

In the present case, the sale was not uploaded on the Government ***e-Vahan*** portal before 31.03.2020.

In view of the above, this Court is unable to entertain the present writ petition.
