The prayer in this petition is for quashing of the FIR No.128 dated 27.6.2019 (Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 323, 342, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Section 325 added later on) with Police Station Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 28.12.2021 (Annexure P-2) arrived at between the petitioners and respondent no.2.

Vide order dated 7.2.2022 this Court had directed the parties to appear before Trial Court/ Illaqa Magistrate for getting their statements recorded in terms of certain parameters given in the aforesaid order dated 7.2.2022 with regard to the compromise dated 28.12.2021 (Annexure P-2).

In terms of the order dated 7.2.2022 passed by this Court, parties have appeared before the Court of Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sultanpur Lodhi, and as per the report dated 22.2.2022 submitted to this Court, both the parties have got recorded their respective statements in Court.

Perusal of the aforesaid report would show that the parties have effected a genuine compromise without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence. In view of the compromise there is a remote possibility of the complainant coming forward to support the prosecution case. The powers under Section 482 Cr.PC can be exercised in such like situation in order to prevent unnecessary vagaries of criminal trial to be faced by the parties, when there are remote chances of conviction of the accused. The compromise in question is found to be fully in consonance with the direction issued by the Court in '**Kulwinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab**' 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab & Anr.**', 2012(4) RCR (Crl.) 543.

In view of the aforesaid report of the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sultanpur Lodhi, accompanied by statements of both the parties, the FIR No.128 dated 27.6.2019 (Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 323, 342, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Section 325 added later on) with Police Station Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed.

Petition stands disposed of.
