The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, in case FIR No.100, dated 30.12.2020, under Sections 406 and 498-A of IPC, registered at Police Station Women, Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the parties have failed to arrive at an amicable settlement. Report received from the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, Ludhiana, is also to the same effect.

Learned counsel for the complainant submits that the petitioner had failed to comply with not only the order dated 08<sup>th</sup> March, 2021, passed by a coordinate Bench of this Court, but also the subsequent order dated 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2021, passed by this Court.

On a query put to the learned counsel for the petitioner as to why the petitioner had failed to comply with the aforementioned orders despite an undertaking having been given in the said regard, he submits that despite making all efforts to get in touch with the petitioner, he had failed to do so.

A perusal of the order dated 08<sup>th</sup> March, 2021, passed by the coordinate Bench of this Court, reveals that it had been categorically observed therein that in case the petitioner failed to comply with the order of this Court, the instant petition would be dismissed.

In the facts and circumstances as enumerated hereinabove, the instant petition stands dismissed.
