[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 21.08.2019, in CWP No.21982 of 2019 in case titled as 'Deepak Kumar versus State of Punjab and others.'

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1), reveals that CWP No.21982 of 2019, was disposed of by directing respondent No.4 to examine the claim of the petitioner against the backdrop of representation dated 15.07.2019 expeditiously and in any case within eight weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and if any amount was found due to the petitioner, to release the same to the petitioner without any further delay.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel states that in compliance of order (Annexure P-1) dated 21.08.2019, claim of the petitioner has been decided and the petitioner released benefits as per entitlement

determined by respondent No.4 vide order (Annexure R-1) dated 04.11.2019 and that in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
