The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No. 0467 dated 21.09.2017 registered under Sections 363, 366-A, 120-B IPC (Section 473 IPC added later on) at Police Station Civil Lines, Police Commissionerate Amritsar on the basis of a written compromise dated 20.01.2020 (Annexure P-4).

On 28.01.2020, this Court passed the following order : -

“This is the petition under Section 482 Cr.PC for quashing FIR No.467 dated 21.09.2017 registered under Sections 363, 366-A and 120-B IPC (Section 473 IPC added later on) at Police Station Civil Lines, Police Commissionerate Amritsar and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise.

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Sakshi Piwal, Advocate has put in an appearance

on behalf of respondents No.2 and 3 and filed power of attorney in Court today, which is taken on record.

Adjourned to 26.03.2020.

Meanwhile, parties are directed to present themselves before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial court on 26.02.2020 for getting their statements recorded with regard to the factum of compromise so effected between them. The Illaqa Magistrate/trial court is directed to record the statements of both the parties specifying the following:

- i) The name of the complainant and all accused arrayed in the FIR; whether all of them have appeared and made their respective statements in support of the compromise so effected between them;*
- ii) Whether any of the accused has been declared a Proclaimed Offender;*
- iii) The stage of trial/proceedings;*
- iv) If the compromise so arrived at between the parties is genuine, voluntarily and out of free will.*

The Illaqa Magistrate/trial court is further directed to send a report along with statements of the parties with regard to the validity or otherwise of the compromise so effected between the parties.”

In pursuance to the afore quoted order a report dated 26.02.2020 from the Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar has been received as per which the petitioners have been acquitted.

In view of the above, no further order is required to be passed in the present petition.
