These two revision petitions have been preferred out of the dispute arising due to the matrimonial discord between the parties to the litigation. In Civil Revision No.8407 of 2016, the husband assails the correctness of the order striking off his defence on account of the non-payment of arrears of maintenance, whereas in Civil Revision No.8545 of 2016, the wife complains that the trial court did not award the adequate maintenance pendente lite.

The learned counsel representing the respondent-wife admits that during the pendency of the present revision petition, the decree for the dissolution of the marriage by way of divorce has been passed. She submits that these revision petitions are rendered infructuous and be disposed of as such.
