[1] Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

[2] Prayer in the petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India, is for initiating action against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order (Annexure P-1) dated 02.09.2019 in CWP No.23204 of 2019.

[3] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that while issuing notice of motion in CWP No.23204 of 2019 for 30.10.2019, interim order was passed in the same terms as in CWP No.14141 of 2019.

[4] A perusal of order (Annexure P-2) dated 24.05.2019 in CWP No.14141 of 2019 reveals that while issuing notice of motion, it was ordered that in the meantime, the petitioner would proceed on Child Care Leave and the respondents would make arrangement for part time teacher.

[5] Learned counsel contends that although the petitioner

salary for the period December, 2019 to April, 2020 was not released to the petitioner, therefore, the instant petition was filed but after the filing of the instant petition, salary of the petitioner for the aforementioned period was released in the month of July, 2020, therefore, in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the contempt petition and the same may be disposed of as such.

[6] Accordingly, in the light of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
