Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.158 dated 26.11.2019, registered for offences under Sections 406 and 498-A of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, at Women Police Station, Chandigarh, Annexure P-1.

FIR, Annexure P-1, is an outcome of a matrimonial dispute and petitioner is the mother-in-law of complainant-respondent No.2.

While issuing notice in the petition, this Court directed the parties to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

However, the Mediation proceedings could not succeed.

Vide order dated 15.03.2022, petitioner was granted interim protection and was directed to join investigation.

Upon instructions, State counsel submits that some recovery is yet to be effected from the petitioner, which fact has been disputed by the counsel for the petitioner.

In the connected petition (CRM-M-5054-2020), without admitting the allegations, husband of the complainant has given a cheque of Rs.2.5 lacs to the complainant towards payment of articles alleged to be in his possession.

In view of the above, but without commenting upon the allegations levelled in the FIR, present petition is allowed.

Order dated 15.03.2022 granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
