1. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that CM-2611-CWP-2019, seeking impleadment of the petitioner in CWP-5149-2016, is pending and no orders have been passed ordering the impleadment of the petitioner as a party in the said writ petition. Learned counsel further states that in the circumstances, the petitioner does not press the instant petition at this stage and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to file a fresh petition in the eventuality of the petitioner being impleaded as party in CWP-5149-2016 and order Annexure P/1 dated 09.05.2019, in CWP-5149-2016, being extended in favour of the petitioner also.

2. In view of the position noted above as well as the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, at this stage, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
