1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order (Annexure P-1), dated 19.08.2019, in CWP No.21603 of 2019.

2. A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that CWP No.21603 of 2019, was disposed of vide order dated 19.08.2019 by directing the Executive Engineer, Canal Lining Division, Sri Muktsar Sahib to examine the claim of the petitioner against the backdrop of representation dated 25.06.2019 expeditiously and in any case within 08 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and if any amount was found due to the petitioner, to release the same without any further delay.

3. Learned counsel contends that pursuant to order dated 19.08.2019, respondent No.4 has passed supplementary speaking orders dated 26.02.2020, holding the petitioner entitled to payment of Rs.7,49,636/- to be released by the District Treasury Officer, Sri Muktsar

pursuance thereto, the petitioner has been released payment as per entitlement determined vide the aforementioned speaking order dated 26.02.2020 and that in the circumstances, the petitioner does not press the instant petition.

4. Accordingly, in view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
