By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'regular bail' under the provisions of Section 439 Cr.P.C., upon FIR No.112, dated 03.04.2021, having been registered at Police Station Rania, District Sirsa, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 147/148/323/326/379-B/506 of the IPC (with Section 307 of the IPC added later).

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner not having been named in the FIR, thereafter he was arraigned as an accused on an alleged disclosure statement made and even then he is only attributed an injury with a wooden *danda*, he having remained in custody now for about 9 months, with the trial still to effectively commence.

Learned State counsel as regards the factual position could not deny the same, as per his instructions, but further submits that there is one another criminal case registered against the petitioner alleging therein the

commission of an offence punishable under Section 323 of the IPC.

Learned counsel for the complainant obviously opposes the petitioner being admitted to bail.

Having considered the matter, in view of the above, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be admitted to bail, upon him furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial court.
