The matter has been taken up through video-conferencing on account of outbreak of pandemic COVID-19.

The petitioner has invoked the writ jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking appropriate writ in the nature of mandamus for issuance of directions to the respondents to treat the adhoc service of the petitioner from 01.10.1994 to 22.12.2001 as qualifying service for pensionary benefits and the petitioner be paid the balance of pensionary benefits along with arrears of salary and interest @ 18% p.a. with all consequential benefits and in alternative to decide the legal notice dated 17.01.2022 (Annexure P-4).

Ms. Anju Sharma Kaushik, Dy. Advocate General, Punjab puts in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the said respondents. Copy of the paper book has been supplied to her.

Upon hearing learned counsel for both the sides and on perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with direction to the official respondents to consider the legal notice dated 17.01.2022 (Annexure P4), as representation and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

If found entitled and if there is no impediment for the release of payment, the same be granted to the petitioner without any delay, as per law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
