On 24.02.2022, the following order had been passed by this
court:-

“Case heard via video conferencing.

By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'interim bail' under the provisions of Section 439 Cr.P.C., for period of 2 months, upon FIR No.136, dated 16.08.2021, having been registered at Police Station STF, SAS Nagar, alleging therein the commission of an offence punishable under the provisions of Section 22 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioners' wife is having a difficult pregnancy, with her due date of delivery being 21.03.2022 and with there being nobody in her home to look after her as her inlaws lives in Jakhal (Haryana), and she is residing in Nabha and that her own mother also does not reside in Nabha.

Though it would be difficult to understand as to why either her inlaws or her mother cannot come to look after her or she cannot go there, with her husband obviously being in custody, yet simply to determine the response of the State and as to whether there is any person available to look after the petitioners' wife, learned State counsel would take instructions in that regard before the next date of hearing.

Adjourned to 07.03.2022.”

Pursuant thereto, an affidavit has been filed by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, STF, Patiala, dated 05.03.2022, specifically stating therein that upon an ASI having been deputed to visit the house where the petitioners' wife is residing, it was found even from the neighbours that she was not suffering from any pregnancy complication and that in fact her mother-in-law, as also her own mother, had come to look after her during her pregnancy and to look after the child immediately thereafter.

That being so, I see no ground to entertain this petition at this stage at least, which is consequently, dismissed.
