1. Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1, dated 20.2.2019, in LPA-2222-2017, in case titled as 'Davinder Singh (deceased) through Pritpal Kaur v. Presiding Officer, Industrial Tribunal, Jalandhar and others.'

2. A perusal of order Annexure P/1, dated 20.2.2019, reveals that LPA-2222-2017, was disposed of and benefits as per entitlement were ordered to be released to the appellant as expeditiously as possible, preferably within three months.

3. Learned counsel contends that although the benefits in terms of order Annexure P-1, dated 20.2.2019, in LPA-2222-2017, have been released to the petitioner, yet the same were released after delay of 13 months / 7 months respectively, after passing of order Annexure P-1,

accordingly, the petitioner does not press the instant petition but prays for liberty to claim interest on the delayed release of payment by way of appropriate proceedings, in accordance with law.

5. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the parties, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
