The matter has been taken up through video-conferencing on account of outbreak of pandemic COVID-19.

The petitioner has invoked the writ jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking appropriate writ in the nature of mandamus for issuance of directions to the respondents to process the claim of late husband of the petitioner for release of pro-rata pension and consequential family pension to the petitioner and in alternate to decide the legal notice dated 22.07.2021 (Annexure P-6).

Heard.

Upon hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and on perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with direction to the official respondents to consider the legal notice dated 22.07.2021 (Annexure P6), as representation and decide the same in

accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

If found entitled and if there is no impediment for the release of payment, the same be granted to the petitioner without any delay, as per law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
