The present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 84 dated 23.06.2021 under Sections 307 and 302 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Sector 31, District Chandigarh.

Learned State counsel has pointed out that out of 25 witnesses, only 7 have been examined and even two material witnesses are yet to be examined.

In view of the above, leaned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission of this Court to withdraw the present petition at this stage. He, however, has prayed that the trial Court be directed to expedite the trial.

In view of the statement made by learned counsel for the petitioner, present petition stands dismissed as withdrawn ,at this stage.

The trial Court is directed to expedite the trial and make every endeavour to complete the same within a period of 7 months from the date of the receipt of the certified copy of the present order.

It is made clear that the second petition for regular bail, if any filed by the petitioner, would be considered independently on its merit in accordance with law.
