[1] Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

[2] Prayer in the petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance or orders, Annexure P/1 dated 01.12.2021 in CWP No.20462 of 2020.

[3] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 dated 01.12.2021 reveals that CWP No.20462 of 2020 was disposed of by directing the respondents to forward the claim of the petitioner as submitted by him by way of representations to the Zonal Administration, Haryana Shahri Vikas Pradhikaran, Gurugram at the earliest and the Zonal Administration, Haryana Shahri Vikas Pradhikaran, Gurugram was directed to decide the representations by passing a speaking order within six weeks.

[4] Mr. Amit Jaiswal, Advocate appearing on behalf of the respondents has produced copy of order dated 08.01.2021. The same is

who on perusal of the same, states that in the circumstances, the petitioner does not wish to pursue the contempt petition and the same may be disposed of as such while granting liberty to the petitioner to challenge order dated 08.01.2021 by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.

[5] Learned counsel for the respondents also states that in view of orders dated 08.01.2021 having been passed in terms of order, Annexure P/1 dated 01.12.2020 in CWP No.20462 of 2020, the contempt petition be disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.

[6] Notice has not been issued in the instant case. However, in view of the position as noted above as also compliance with orders, Annexure, P/1 dated 01.12.2020 in CWP No.20462 of 2020, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against the respondents.

[7] Accordingly, the contempt petition is disposed of as such while granting liberty to the petitioner to challenge order dated 08.01.2021 by way of appropriate proceedings, in accordance with law.
