Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, *inter-alia*, for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release the arrears of salary to the petitioners after completion of 2 years probation period treating their date of joining as 21.04.2017.

At the outset, learned counsel, on instructions from the petitioners submitted that instead of pressing the present petition on merits, his clients would be satisfied in case the legal notice dated 25.08.2021 (P-6) is decided expeditiously.

Mr. Nikhil Chopra, Addl.A.G., Punjab, who is present through Video-Conference, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents, and raises no objection against the innocuous prayer of the petitioners.

In view of the agreed stand taken by both sides, but without going into the merits of the controversy, this writ petition is disposed off with

direction to respondent No.2-The Director, Health & Family Welfare, Punjab, to consider and decide the aforesaid legal notice dated 25.08.2021 (P-6) in accordance with law by passing speaking order within a period of 08 (eight) weeks from the receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to say that in case there is a failure on the part of competent authority, petitioners would be at liberty to move an appropriate application for revival of this writ petition.
