This is second petition that has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.124, dated 02.07.2020, registered under Sections 341, 307, 452, 354, 323, 325, 148, 149, 201 IPC (added lateron) at Police Station Garhshankar, District Hoshiarpur.

It is worthwhile to note that this matter had been argued at length on a previous occasion in CRM-M-20607-2020 and the matter was dismissed.

Counsel for the petitioner would pray for grant of anticipatory bail in this second petition by contending that the co-accused have been

allowed bail and therefore, she is entitled to parity, however, counsel is not able to point out any change in circumstances to entitle the petitioner for grant of anticipatory bail in a second bail petition. In ***G.R. Anand Babu Versus State of Tamil Nadu and another-2021(1) R.C.R. (Criminal) 843***, it has been categorically held by the Supreme Court that consecutive bail applications are not to be entertained.

Faced with this judgment, counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner would seek to withdraw the petition and submit that the petitioner would surrender before the trial Court, however, on her surrender, her bail application be considered expeditiously.

In view of the statement made, the petition is dismissed as withdrawn with an observation that in case the petitioner herein surrenders before the trial Court within a week, her application for bail will be considered within a period of two weeks of its filing.
