Reply filed on behalf of respondents No.2 and 3 in the Court
today is taken on record.

The instant writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of
the Constitution of India for issuance of writ in the nature of Certiorari, for
quashing termination order dated 28.02.2022.

Mr. Mutneja, learned Senior Counsel assisted by Mr. Brijesh
Kumar and Ms. Suverna Mutneja, Advocates appearing for the petitioner
would contend that service of the petitioner has been illegally terminated
without following due process of law i.e. holding of an enquiry or even
paying him compensation. However, at this stage, he would not press the
instant writ petition, in case respondents No.4 and 5 would consider issuing
experience certificate to the petitioner without any stigma, considering the

fact that the petitioner had worked with said respondents from 23.09.2020 till Feb, 2022.

Mr. Nalwa, learned counsel appearing for respondents No.4 and 5 submits that in case the petitioner is willing to withdraw the writ petition, said respondents would have no hesitation in issuing the experience certificate, as prayed.

In view of the fact that the petitioner herein is limiting his prayer at the present moment for issuance of an experience certificate, without any stigma attached to it, the instant writ petition is being disposed of, directing respondents No.4 and 5 to issue necessary experience certificate as sought by the petitioner herein. Let the needful be done within a period of two weeks from today. In case, any grievance of the petitioner still survives, he will be at liberty to revive the instant writ petition.
