This invocation under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure seeks transfer of petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act titled as **Narinderpal Singh** Vs. **Krishna Devi** bearing case No. DMC/1313/2019 instituted on 31.07.2019 (Annexure P/1) pending between the parties to this application in the Court of learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Nakodar to the Court of competent jurisdiction at District

Courts, Ludhiana.

The primary ground on which this invocation has come about is that it is difficult for the petitioner to travel from her village Khandoor, District Ludhiana to the Court at Ludhiana and on account of inconvenience she has sought transfer.

Upon hearing Mr. Lakshay Bector, Advocate for the applicant and perusal of the records.

Both the husband and wife are residents of District Ludhiana and the petition is pending in the Court of learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Nakodar which not very far off and is situated within the District itself. It needs to be kept in mind that it is only in cases of extreme hardship and compelling reasons, the Court needs to exercise its jurisdiction under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure and which provision cannot be put to use merely on the whims and fancies of a party purely to wreck vengeance in a matrimonial dispute between the couple and as such does not require any indulgence by this Court.

The application being without merits stands
dismissed in *limine*.
