[1] Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

[2] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating action against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 11.02.2022 in CWP No.2612 of 2022.

[3] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 dated 11.02.2022 reveals that CWP No.2612 of 2022 was disposed of on the assurance of the learned Assistant Advocate General that the dispute raised by the petitioner, if not already decided, would be decided by the respondents in terms of Clause-K of the DNIT, expeditiously in accordance with law and decision taken thereon would be communicated to the petitioner.

[4] Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the instant petition was filed on account of failure of the respondent to do the needful but after issuance of notice, the respondent has complied with the assurance held out by the learned Assistant Advocate General as noticed in order, Annexure P/1 dated 11.02.2022 in CWP No.2612 of 2022,

therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and the same may be disposed of as such.

[5] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
