The present writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, with a prayer for issuance of a writ in the nature of *Habeas Corpus* to release the persons who have been mentioned in para No.2 of the petition from the illegal detention of the private respondents No.4 and 5.

Notice of motion in the petition was issued by this Court and consequently a short reply has been filed by the District Magistrate, Rupnagar.

Nobody has caused appearance on behalf of the petitioner, however, the learned State counsel has referred to the affidavit filed by the District Magistrate, Rupnagar and has submitted that the Naib Tehsildar, Narpur Bedi along with Labour Inspector, Rupnagar, ASI, Police Station Narpur Bedi and some more persons visited the brick kiln of respondents No.4 and 5 and the petitioner was not present at the spot and they heard the persons

mentioned in the writ petition and also recorded their respective statements and it was found that no person was kept in the brick kiln as a bonded labour and that the present petition which is totally false and frivolous.

In view of the aforesaid submissions made by the learned counsel for the State that nobody was found to be forcibly detained and kept as a bonded labour, nothing survives in the present petition.

Dismissed.
