The prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for the issuance of appropriate directions to respondent Nos.2 and the connected Police Stations of District Amritsar not to harass and humiliate the petitioner by calling him to the different Police Stations time and again, with a further prayer that respondent Nos.2 and 3 be directed to provide at least 10 days time for his appearance while serving a notice under Section 160 Cr.P.C.

None has put in appearance on behalf of the petitioner.

The learned State counsel submits that the petitioner is a habitual offender and the allegations levelled in the petition are baseless.

In fact, as many as 11 more FIRs are pending against the petitioner, the details of which are mentioned hereinbelow:-

24.10.2019 registered under Sections 452, 323, 427, 336, 506, 148, 149
IPC read with Sections 25, 54, 59 of Arms Act.

petitioner, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.
