1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order Annexure P/1 dated 8.4.2019, in CWP-9321-2019.

2. Perusal of order Annexure P/1 dated 8.4.2019 reveals that CWP-9321-2019 was disposed of by directing the respondents to decide legal notice dated 11.2.2019 within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and in case on decision of the legal notice, it was found that the petitioner was entitled for any monetary benefits then the same were to be paid to the petitioner within three months thereafter.

3. Learned counsel contends that the instant petition was filed on account of failure of the respondent to do the needful.

4. Learned AAG, Haryana, has referred to Annexure R-1, decision taken on the legal notice and granting the financial benefits

admissible to the petitioner as per her entitlement alongwith interest and

states that in the circumstances, order dated 8.4.2019 having been complied with, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against respondent No.1.

5. Learned Counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the legal notice having been decided and the benefits having been released to the petitioner as per entitlement in terms of order dated 8.4.2019, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and the same may be disposed of as such.

6. I have considered the submissions of learned counsel and in view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against respondent No.1 under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
