By this order, five petitions i.e CR-1446-2019, CR-1447-2019, CRR-2699-2019, CRR-2737-2019 and CRR-3058-2019 shall stand disposed of.

Both the parties are represented by learned senior counsels. None of the counsel representing the various parties in different revision petitions have any objection to the disposal of the matter in terms of the settlement arrived at. During the course of hearing, a deed of settlement signed by all the contesting parties and counter signed by their respective counsels has been filed. The same is taken on record as Ex.C-1. It has been brought to the notice of the Court that three criminal revision petitions i.e CRR-2699, 2737 and 3058 of 2019 are also pending in this Court. This Court has requisitioned the paperbook of these criminal

revision petitions. The hearing of these petitions is preponed to today and the same are taken on Board for final disposal.

It is agreed between the parties that the entire dispute stand finally settled between the parties in terms of the compromise entered between them, which shall form a part of the order.

Sh.Deepender Singh, Advocate for respondent no.3 in CR-1447-2019 submits that he is not a party to the compromise.

Sh. B.R.Mahajan, has stated that respondent no.3 in CR-1447-2019 is a vendee from respondent no.1 and 2 and his rights are being protected and shall not be affected by the settlement.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, all the afore-mentioned civil and criminal revision petitions are disposed of while expressing gratitude to the learned counsels for helping the parties to amicably resolve the long standing dispute.

It is noted here that the three criminal revision petitions have been filed assailing the correctness of the order of conviction passed by the trial court.

Keeping in view the settlement arrived at between the parties, it is considered appropriate to set aside the order of conviction of the petitioners in criminal revision petitions. Consequently, the petitioners shall stand acquitted.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
