JAISHREE THAKUR, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition that has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying to challenge the disqualification of the petitioner on the ground that his height was less than 168 cm, as described in the advertisement.

Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner herein would submit that the height of the petitioner was measured at 166 CM, which is factually wrong. It submitted that after the rejection, the petitioner got himself medically examined from a private doctor who recorded his height at 168 CM on 17.01.2022 vide certificate Annexure P-5. It is contended that the petitioner is entitled to get his height measurement again by the Commission.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and perusing the pleadings, the prayer of the petitioner cannot be acceded to. There is a certificate already on the record showing that the petitioner does not have the necessary

qualification to be considered for appointment as Constable as he does not have the prescribed height. The petitioner is not able to produce on record the measurement that was taken again i.e. on 03.02.2022. In such circumstances, when the petitioner has already been remeasured, there would be no occasion to have his measurement taken again on third time.

Consequently this petition is dismissed being devoid of merits.
