The instant petition has been preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, 1959, seeking issuance of an appropriate writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release the amount of Rs.51,000/- as Kanyadan Yojna + Rs.50,000/- as financial assistance on account of the marriage of children/daughter.

The petitioner had espoused the grievance that the due payments under the Social Welfare Scheme of the Haryana Government have not been released by the respondents even though the petitioner is eligible for the same.

On notice, short reply on behalf of respondent No.2 by way of affidavit of Anurag Gahlawat, Joint Secretary, Haryana Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, has been filed wherein it has been stated that when the documents appended along with application for seeking release of financial assistance were verified, it was found that the marriage certificate had been cancelled by the Competent Authority on 24.02.2021. In addition to above, there were other discrepancies also as noticed in the application submitted by the petitioner and accordingly, a communication was sent to the petitioner and he was made aware that as and when the said discrepancies shall be removed and the marriage certificate shall be submitted, all the admissible benefits under the Social Welfare Scheme shall be extended. The letters have been duly referred in the aforesaid response.

In view of the stand adopted by respondent No.2 in its response, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the instant petition so as to approach the respondent No.2 with the requisite documents and after removing the discrepancies noticed by respondent No.2. In the event of petitioner fulfilling the conditions as prescribed and supplying of the necessary documents, the due payment shall be released to the petitioner within a period of 04 weeks thereafter.

The petition is disposed of accordingly.
