[1] Prayer in the petition under Sections 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is for initiating action against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 20.09.2019 in CWP No. 26869 of 2019.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 dated 20.09.2019 reveals that CWP No.26869 of 2019 was disposed of by directing the respondents to decide appeal dated 23.05.2012 within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order, if not already decided.

[3] Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the instant petition was filed on account of failure of the respondent to do the needful.

[4] Learned Addl. A.G. on the other hand refers to order, Annexure R-1/1 dated 07.08.2020 deciding the appeal filed by the petitioner and states that in view of order of this Court dated 20.09.2019 in CWP No.26869 of 2019 having been complied with, the instant

petition be disposed of as not calling for any action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 against the respondent.

[5] Learned counsel for the petitioner also states that in view of order, Annexure R-1/1 dated 07.08.2020 having been passed in compliance of the aforementioned order, the petitioner does not press the instant petition at this stage.

[6] Accordingly, in view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
