The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of directions to respondents No.3 to 5 to take legal action on the representation/complaint dated 11.01.2022 (Annexure P-1) moved by the petitioner against respondents No.6 to 8.

It is submitted that the petitioner had three sisters and one brother. The father of the petitioner purchased one plot bearing No.2113, C Block, Ranjit Avenue, Amritsar in the name of elder sister of the petitioner namely Asha Rani in the year 1986, the construction of which was also done by the petitioner's father. The said sister of the petitioner got married in the year 1990 and her husband got expired in the year 2006. The other sister of the petitioner namely Usha Devi was got married at Rajpura, Patiala and the petitioner as well as her third sister Kiran @ Guddi were unmarried and their brother had died long ago. The father of the petitioner had also expired earlier and unfortunately, during the Covid period, all three sisters of the petitioner also got expired. The eldest sister of the petitioner Asha Rani executed a Will dated 05.09.2020 before her death in favour of the petitioner and her nephew Ajay Kumar and bequeathed all movable and

properties were sanctioned in the name of Ajay Kumar and the present petitioner.

It is further submitted that respondent No.5, who is brother of Pushpanand, husband of deceased Asha Rani (sister of petitioner) on the basis of a forged and fabricated Will dated 20.02.2019, challenged the mutation sanctioned in favour of the petitioner. Although, the petitioner challenged the order dated 17.09.2021 passed in favour of respondent No.5 and got the stay granted in her favour vide order dated 04.01.2022, but respondent No.5 in order to usurp the property in question, sold the same vide registered sale deed dated 13.12.2021 to one Ashneet Walia daughter of Surinder Singh Walia.

Consequently, the petitioner moved a detailed representation dated 11.01.2022 (Annexure P-1) to respondent No.3-Commissioner of Police, Amritsar, but till date, no action has been taken on the same.

Now, the prayer on behalf of the petitioner is that a direction be issued to the official respondents to decide the representation of the petitioner in an expeditious manner.

Notice of motion.

Mr. V.G.Jauhar, Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and has no objection if an appropriate direction be issued for deciding the representation of the petitioner.

In view of the above, the instant criminal writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3-Commissioner of Police, Amritsar to decide the representation dated 11.01.2022 (Annexure P-1) within a period of one month from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

Registry is directed to send a copy of this order along with copy of the petition and above said representation to respondent No.3- Commissioner of Police, Amritsar for requisite compliance within the time period granted by this Court.
