[1] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that CRWP No.468 of 2019 out of which the instant petition arises, has been disposed of vide order dated 21.03.2022 and that in the circumstances, the petitioner may be permitted to withdraw the instant petition with liberty to take out appropriate proceedings for redress of grievances of the petitioner in accordance with law, otherwise than by way of a contempt petition.

[2] In view of the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against the respondent.

[3] Accordingly, the contempt petition is disposed of as such while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
