1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 09.02.2021, in CWP-2805-2021.

2. A perusal of order Annexure P-1 dated 09.02.2021, reveals that CWP-2805-2021, was disposed of by directing the respondent to decide representation dated 19.09.2020, in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order, within one week from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

3. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to notice to the respondents on 25.03.2022, claim of the petitioner as contained in representation dated 19.09.2020, has been decided, in terms of order Annexure P/1 dated 19.09.2020 inCWP-2805-2021, therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and the same may be permitted to be withdrawn while granting liberty to the petitioner to challenge order dated 13.04.2022, by way of

appropriate proceedings, in accordance with law.

4. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent(s) under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
