The petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 34 dated 11.02.2019, registered under Sections 22, 29 and 58 of the NDPS Act, 1985 at Police Station Civil Lines, Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per allegations in the FIR, it is stated that a secret information was received by Inspector Parveen Kumar that one Amrinderpal Singh is indulged in the business of supplying drugs in the villages of Gurdaspur and Amritsar and is a supplier of heroin in Amritsar. It was further informed that if he is apprehended, a large quantity of heroin can be recovered.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that later on, said Amrinderpal Singh filed a petition bearing CRM-M-5203-2020 before this Court alleging that he has falsely been implicated and a fair inquiry was prayed for. During the pendency of the said petition, an SIT was constituted headed by AIG, STF, Jalandhar and in the inquiry, it was found that Amrinderpal Singh was having a dispute with other Dalbir Singh, Paramjit Singh and Jugraj Singh and the petitioner, in conspiracy with aforesaid

persons, falsely implicated Amrinderpal Singh in the present case by planting a recovery of 200 grams of heroin. It is also found in the inquiry that during the period from 01.01.2019 to 10.03.2019, the petitioner had conversations on his mobile phone with aforesaid accused persons, who were having litigation with Amrinderpal Singh. The SIT concluded that the petitioner has falsely implicated Amrinderpal Singh by planting 200 grams of heroin, which was procured by the petitioner. Thereafter, the petitioner was also nominated in the FIR by adding Sections 22 and 29 of the NDPS Act.

Learned State counsel submits that it is a case, where the petitioner has misused his official powers by falsely implicating aforesaid Amrinderpal Singh in a case under the NDPS Act by planting 200 grams of heroin and this fact has been found to be true by the SIT, comprising three senior police officers.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and considering the serious allegations against the petitioner, I find no ground to grant him the concession of anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.
