Instant petition was filed seeking a mandamus to direct the Commissioner of Income Tax (Appeals)-2, Ludhiana to finally decide an appeal dated 10.06.2016 (Annexure P-4) that had been preferred by the petitioner in a time bound manner.

Counsel has contended that the appeal has been hanging fire and has not been decided till date inspite of six years having lapsed.

Reliance is also been placed upon a letter dated 04.07.2018 (Annexure P-5) issued by the Central Board of Direct Taxes providing that appeals against high pitched scrutiny assessments ought to be taken up for expeditious disposal.

An advance copy of the writ paper book has been served upon the respondent, Mr. Vaibhav Gupta, Junior Standing Counsel has entered appearance on behalf of the respondents.

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Mr. Vaibhav Gupta, Advocate, makes a statement that the appeal dated 10.06.2016 (Annexure P-4) would be decided on merits within a period of six weeks from today.

Writ petition is disposed of.

It is clarified that we have not examined the issue on merits.
