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**SANT PARKASH, J. (ORAL)**

The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of direction to official respondents to take appropriate legal action against private respondents by registering FIR under appropriate provisions of law and also to decide representations dated NIL and 01.03.2022 (Annexures P-3 and P-5 respectively) and get the said complaints enquired by some higher and impartial officer.

It is submitted that respondent No.7 has played a fraud of Rs.70 Lakh upon the petitioner on the pretext of getting married to her. The petitioner is the resident of Australia and respondent No.7-Vinod Kumar went to Australia in the year 2008 on study visa. Both of them met with each other in Sydney on new year party and in 2014, they started living together in Melbourne. Respondent No.7 used the hard earned money of the petitioner for his personal expenses and gains and came back to India on expiry of his visa on 11.11.2016. He sought money from the petitioner for building a house in CHD City Karnal on the pretext of living there along with the petitioner after getting married to her, which was actually a

ploy to secure money from the latter. In order to further extract money from the petitioner, respondent No.7 also got a Will registered mentioning the petitioner therein as his wife (Annexure P-1). After the completion of construction of said house, respondent No.7 got the said Will cancelled on 24.12.2020 (Annexure P-2). It is further submitted that respondents No.8 to 11 are also accomplices of respondent No.7 in the said conspiracy and all of them in connivance with each other, are threatening to kill the petitioner and her minor son upon her return to India.

Consequently, left with no other option, the petitioner moved a detailed representation dated Nil (Annexure P-3) to Superintendent of Police, Karnal, which was marked to the Economic Wing, Karnal, wherein the office incharge submitted the enquiry report i.e. Annexure P-4.

Feeling dissatisfied with the said enquiry report, the petitioner again submitted a detailed representation dated 01.03.2022 (Annexure P-5) to Director General of Police Haryana and Superintendent of Police, Karnal, but till date, no action has been taken on the same.

Now, the prayer on behalf of the petitioner is that a direction be issued to the official respondents to decide the representation of the petitioner in an expeditious manner.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Amreek Singh Narwal, Deputy Advocate General, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and has no objection if an appropriate direction be issued for deciding the representation of the petitioner.

In view of the above, the instant criminal writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2–DGP Haryana, Sector 6, Panchkula to decide the representation dated 01.03.2022 (Annexure P-5) within a period of one month from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

Registry is directed to send a copy of this order along with copy of the petition and above said representation to respondent No.2-DGP Haryana, Sector 6, Panchkula for requisite compliance within the time period granted by this Court.
