AMAN CHAUDHARY, J.(ORAL)

The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for directing the respondent authorities to initiate appropriate legal action against the private respondent so as to provide justice to the petitioner.

As per the averments made in the petition, the petitioner is 21 years old complainant girl who got married to the accused without the consent of the parents and after 4 days she came to know that the accused was already married and has four children living in Bihar. Thereafter, she left him and the said accused was threatening her.

On instructions of ASI Rakesh Kumar, learned State counsel submits that the petitioner was called by the Police many a times, however,

the petitioner did not respond or make herself available for substantiating the allegations made by her.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent No.4, against whom the allegations have been made by the petitioner submits that he has instructions from his client to state that there shall be no such incident of threatening from his side.

None has appeared on behalf of the petitioner on the number of dates.

In view of the aforesaid stand of the State as well as the counsel for the respondent No.4, the petition has been rendered infructuous.

Disposed of as such. However, liberty is granted to the petitioner to avail any other alternate remedy in accordance with law.
