The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.571 dated 25.10.2018 registered under Sections 186, 323, 332, 353, 354-A, 427 and 506 IPC at Police Station Dharuhera, Rewari on the basis of a compromise dated 22.03.2022 (Annexure P-2) entered into between the parties.

On 20.04.2022 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the veracity of the compromise between the parties as also to apprise this Court whether all the accused are party to the compromise; whether any of them have ever been declared proclaimed offender(s) and if is there any other criminal case pending against them.

As directed, report dated 17.05.2022 from the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Rewari has been received as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them; the same is genuine and has been entered into with

free will and consent of the parties and is without any fear or pressure of any kind; only the petitioner is arrayed as an accused; he has not been declared a proclaimed offender and that no other criminal case is pending against him.

Learned State counsel has no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR in which offences are not heinous as also the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in *Narinder Singh vs State of Punjab* (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash FIR No.571 dated 25.10.2018 registered under Sections 186, 323, 332, 353, 354-A, 427 and 506 IPC at Police Station Dharuhera, Rewari and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners.
