This is a petition that has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.299 dated 13.06.2020 registered under Sections 323, 506, 34 IPC and Section 3 of the SC & ST Act (Sections 325, 307 IPC and Section 3 of the SC & ST Act added later on) at Police Station Camp Palwal, District Palwal.

Counsel for the petitioner herein would contend false implication in the said matter. It is argued that the charges have been framed and the injured and the complainant have already been examined, who in fact have not supported the version of the prosecution. It is further argued that the trial is likely to take some time to conclude and therefore, prays for grant of regular bail to the petitioner.

Learned counsel appearing for the respondent-State opposes grant of regular bail to the petitioner by contending that the allegations levelled against him are serious in nature, however, he does not dispute the fact that the

injured and the complainant have been examined, who did not support the prosecution version.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have perused the paper book. Keeping in view the fact that the injured and the complainant have already been examined, who did not support the version of the prosecution and the fact that the trial is likely to take some time to conclude, no useful purpose would be served in keeping the petitioner behind bars. Consequently, the instant petition is allowed and the petitioner is directed to be released on regular bail on his execution of adequate personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of concerned trial Court/Duty Magistrate. However, it is made clear that any observation made herein shall not be construed to be an expression on merits of the case.
