HARSIMRAN SINGH SETHI J. (ORAL)

By this common order, four writ petitions, the details of which have been given in the heading of the order, are being disposed of as all the petitions involve the same question of law on similar facts.

In the present petitions, the grievance of the petitioner(s) is that the petitioner(s) who are working as Extension Lecturers, their services are likely to be discontinued despite the fact that there exist due workload for the post in question.

Further prayer of the petitioner(s) is that they should be allowed to continue till the regular incumbents joins or in the alternative, they be adjusted wherever the workload of the subject which the petitioner(s) are teaching, exist.

Learned State counsel, keeping in view the paragraph 6 of the reply filed in CWP No.8261 of 2021, submits that the present petitions filed by the petitioner(s) are on mere apprehension that they are likely to be replaced but no such action has been taken so far. Learned State counsel further submits that till the regular incumbents join or the workload of the post on which the petitioner(s) are discharging the duties exist, whichever is earlier, the petitioner(s) will be allowed to continue in case their claim is covered under the policy of the Government of Haryana dated 04.03.2020 read with the amendment dated 11.05.2022.

Learned State counsel further submits that as of now, there is no move to discontinue with the services of the petitioner(s).

Learned counsel for the petitioner(s) submits that keeping in view the above statement of the learned State counsel, no further orders are required to be passed in the present writ petitions and the same may kindly be disposed of as such.

Ordered accordingly.
