The petitioner herein has approached this Court seeking appointment to the post of Constable in terms of advertisement dated 29.09.2011 under 2% posts reserved for wards of police personnel.

It is contended that the petitioner participated in the said examination and qualified and he was even called for the interview. However, on account of various court litigations, the said appointment was not offered. It is further contended that now the office of respondent No.2 has offered letters of appointment to various candidates under the said 2% quota and the petitioner would be entitled to appointment as he was a successful candidate.

Counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner would be satisfied in case the respondents were to consider his legal notice that he has sent (Annexures P-11/P-14) in terms of various orders passed by the High Court as attached with the writ petition. It is submitted that even

though he had sent legal notice, he prays that this writ petition be treated as a detailed representation which could be decided within a time bound manner.

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. Pawan Sharda, Senior DAG, Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Keeping in view the request of counsel for the petitioner, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to treat the instant petition as a representation and to decide the same within a period of two months, from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law and convey the decision to the petitioner. In case of failure to do so, the officer responsible for the lapse would be liable to costs of Rs.20,000/- from his personal pocket, to be deposited with the Punjab and Haryana High Court Advocates Welfare Fund.
