Learned counsel for the petitioners argues that in the present case, the probation period of the petitioners has not been taken into account as a qualifying service for computing the pensionary benefits only on the ground that the CPF was not deducted for the said period. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the settled principle of law settled by this Court in CWP No. 5897 of 2003 titled as ***Prem Chand Tagla and others Vs. State of Haryana and others***, the petitioners are entitled for computing the probation period as a qualifying service for computing the pensionary benefits and appropriate direction needs to be issued to the respondents for the said purpose.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the grievance raised in the present petition has also been raised by the petitioners in the

consideration with the respondents and the petitioners will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a direction is issued to respondent No. 2 to decide the same by passing an appropriate speaking order in a time bound manner.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Raman Kumar Sharma, learned Additional Advocate General, Haryana, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and raises no objection in deciding the legal notice dated 14.03.2022 (Annexure P-3) in a time bound manner by passing an appropriate speaking order.

In view of the pleadings in the present petition, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case or the claim being made by the petitioners in the legal notice, respondent No. 2 is directed to decide the legal notice dated 14.03.2022 (Annexure P-3), by passing a speaking order within a period of eight weeks from the receipt of copy of this order.

Present writ petition stands disposed of.
