Prayer in this petition, filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is for issuance of directions to official respondents to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondent Nos. 4 and 5.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioner No. 1 Jasvir Kaur is a married woman having two children and she was married to one Jasvir Singh son of Joginder Singh on 13.11.2005, who is the resident of village Kattu. Later on, in 2006, she was thrown out of her matrimonial home along with her children and now she is having a live-in-relationship with petitioner No. 2 Honey Sharma.

It is stated that respondent No. 4 Gurmail Kaur is the sister of petitioner No. 1 and respondent No. 5 is friend of respondent No. 4 and they are residing in Barnala and are extending threats to the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that a representation (Annexure P-1) was given to SSP, Barnala against respondent Nos. 4 and 5 stating the aforesaid facts and that the private

respondents are putting pressure on petitioner No. 1 to start residing with her husband and on that pretext, they are extending threats.

On a bare perusal of the aforesaid representation/complaint (Annexure P-1) and also in view of the fact that the husband of petitioner No. 1 is not arrayed as respondent in this case, no cognizable offence is made out.

On the face of it, the aforesaid representation has been filed to give a legal color to the illegal relationship of the petitioners.

Therefore, the present petition is dismissed.
