This is petitioner's 4<sup>th</sup> attempt to get bail during the pendency of the trial. The petitioner is an accused in a criminal case arising from FIR No.94, dated 16.05.2017, under Sections 307, 148, 149 Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 25/27 Arms Act, registered at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar Rural.

As per the case of prosecution, the 1<sup>st</sup> informant along with his friend was travelling on a motorcycle, when the petitioner along with two other boys chased them and the petitioner opened fire and one of the bullet hit the 1<sup>st</sup> informant on his right thigh. Other accused also fired bullets in the air while fleeing from the side. It has been noticed in the order dated 17.08.2020 that the petitioner is involved in three more criminal cases including under the one Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

Learned counsel representing the petitioner contends that the Ist informant, when appeared as PW1, he did not identify the petitioner.

It is evident that the Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar has recorded in its order dated 22.04.2022 that the 1<sup>st</sup> informant turned hostile on account of the undue influence of the petitioner. Rather, the Court has noticed that the petitioner, while in custody, has such kind of influence.

Hence no ground for grant of bail is made out.

Dismissed.

The trial Court is requested to make sincere endeavour for speedy disposal of the case.
