[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating action against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 16.10.2018 in CWP No.11720 of 2018 in case titled as Ram Kishore and Ors. vs. Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Patiala.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.11720 of 2018 was disposed of by directing the respondents to look into the matter and release payment on account of interest on pensionary benefits to the petitioner within two months.

[3] Vide order dated 16.01.2020, Mr. Gulovleen Singh Sidhu, the then Managing Director, Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Patiala, was impleaded as respondent while today, Mr. Anupam Singla, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent has filed reply by way of affidavit of Sh. Bhupinder Pal Singh, currently, Managing Director, Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Patiala, giving details of the payment released to the petitioners on account of interest towards gratuity, leave encashment and

The affidavit is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners who on perusal thereof states that in view of the needful having been done in terms of order, Annexure P/1 dated 16.10.2018 in CWP No.11720 of 2018, she does not press the instant petition.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
