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DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (Oral)

The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.0285 dated 18.09.2020 registered under Sections 406 and 498-A IPC at Police Station City Kapurthala, district Kapurthala and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners, on the basis of a written compromise (Annexure P-2).

Since petitioner No.2 has expired, the present petition qua him has become infructuous and therefore disposed of as such.

So far as other petitioners are concerned, on 18.05.2022, this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court on 30.05.2022 for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the veracity of the compromise

between the parties as also to apprise this Court whether P.O. proceedings are pending against any of the accused.

As directed, report dated 15.06.2022 from the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kapurthala has been received, as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them and that no proclamation proceedings are pending against the petitioners.

Learned State counsel has also raised no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR, which arises out of a matrimonial dispute and the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in ***Narinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab & Anr. (2014) 6 SCC 466***, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash FIR No.0285 dated 18.09.2020 registered under Sections 406 and 498-A IPC at Police Station City Kapurthala, district Kapurthala and all proceedings arising therefrom qua petitioners No.1, 3 and 4.
