[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-8, dated 05.12.2019, in COCP No.2786 of 2019.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-8) dated 05.12.2019 reveals that COCP No.2786 of 2019 was disposed of by directing the petitioner to appear in the office of the concerned authority for completing the formalities, whereafter the amount would be released to the petitioner within four weeks thereafter, while decision with regard to the family pension, the concerned authority would take a decision within twelve weeks and the petitioner as well as the mother of the deceased Manoj Kumar would be given an opportunity to put forth their claims.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the petitioner having been granted all benefits as per entitlement pursuant to opportunity of hearing in terms of order, Annexure P/8 dated 05.12.2019 in COCP No.2786 of 2019, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of

learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
