Learned counsel representing respondent Nos.1 and 2 submits that the passport has already been issued to the petitioner on 27.07.2022 and as such, the grievance raised in the petition does not survive.

In view of the above, learned counsel would seek that as no further orders are required in this case, the present petition be disposed of accordingly.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is not in a position to accept and deny the said statement but however submits that liberty be granted to the petitioner that in case any part of the cause of action still survives, the petitioner may seek revival of the petition.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above and that the only grievance raised in the petition is for issuance of the passport, which has been issued as noticed above, no further orders are called for.

Dismissed as having been rendered infructuous.

However, liberty is granted to the petitioner to seek revival of the petition in case any cause of action still survives.
