The present revision petition is directed against the judgment of conviction dated 26.03.2004 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Panipat, whereby accused Ram Phal (respondent No.1) and Sultan (respondent No.2) were ordered to be acquitted. The present petition has been filed after a long delay of 1684 days.

I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner on the question of delay in filing the present revision petition.

From the perusal of case file, it cannot be said that there was sufficient cause for condonation of such a huge delay of 1684 days in filing the revision petition. No valid justification has been given by the learned counsel for petitioner in the application for condoning the long delay of 1684 days in filing the present revision petition.

In view of the above, the present application for condonation of delay of 1684 days in filing the criminal revision petition is dismissed. Consequently, the present revision petition is also ordered to be dismissed being hopelessly time barred.
