[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/2 dated 02.09.2021 in CWP No.6672 of 2021 in case titled as Bachittar Singh vs. The Punjab State Power Corporation Limited and others.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/2 reveals that CWP No.6672 of 2021 was disposed of by directing the official respondents to consider representation dated 08.02.2021 and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within one month from the date of receipt of a certified copy of the order.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the respondent has already passed order dated 01.10.2021 rejecting part of the claim of the petitioner as contained in the representation dated 08.02.2021. Copy of order dated 01.10.2021 is taken on record and the same has already been supplied to the petitioner. Learned counsel for the

petitioner states that in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the contempt petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to challenge order dated 01.10.2021 to the extent adverse to the interest of the petitioner by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
