Through the present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.196 dated 08.08.2016 registered under Sections 341, 506, 379, 356, 354-D and 509 IPC at Police Station, Industrial Area, Chandigarh.

On 01.06.2022 this Court had passed the following order: -

“Learned counsel for the petitioner inter-alia contends that the petitioner was granted regular bail by the Trial Court and thereafter regularly appearing in the trial but only due to a communication gap between him and his counsel appearing for him before the Trial Court he could not appear on 11.04.2022.

Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes on behalf of the petitioner that the petitioner shall appear on each and every date in his trial in future unless specifically exempted.

Notice of motion for 13.09.2022.

After considering the afore submissions and in line with the undertaking made on behalf of the petitioner he is permitted to appear before the Trial Court on the next date fixed before it i.e. 30.06.2022 with a further direction to the Trial Court that on appearance by the petitioner on 30.06.2022 he shall be admitted to ad interim bail to the Trial Court's satisfaction.

Before the adjourned date the State shall file a status report.”

Learned State counsel submits that in pursuance to the afore quoted order the petitioner has shown his *bonafides* by appearing before the Trial Court and that on such appearance he has been admitted to interim bail to the Trial Court's satisfaction.

After considering the above submissions made on behalf of the petitioner as recorded in the afore quoted order and because the petitioner has shown his *bonafides* by appearing before the Trial Court, it is directed that the Trial Court shall now consider making the petitioner's bail absolute in accordance with law.
